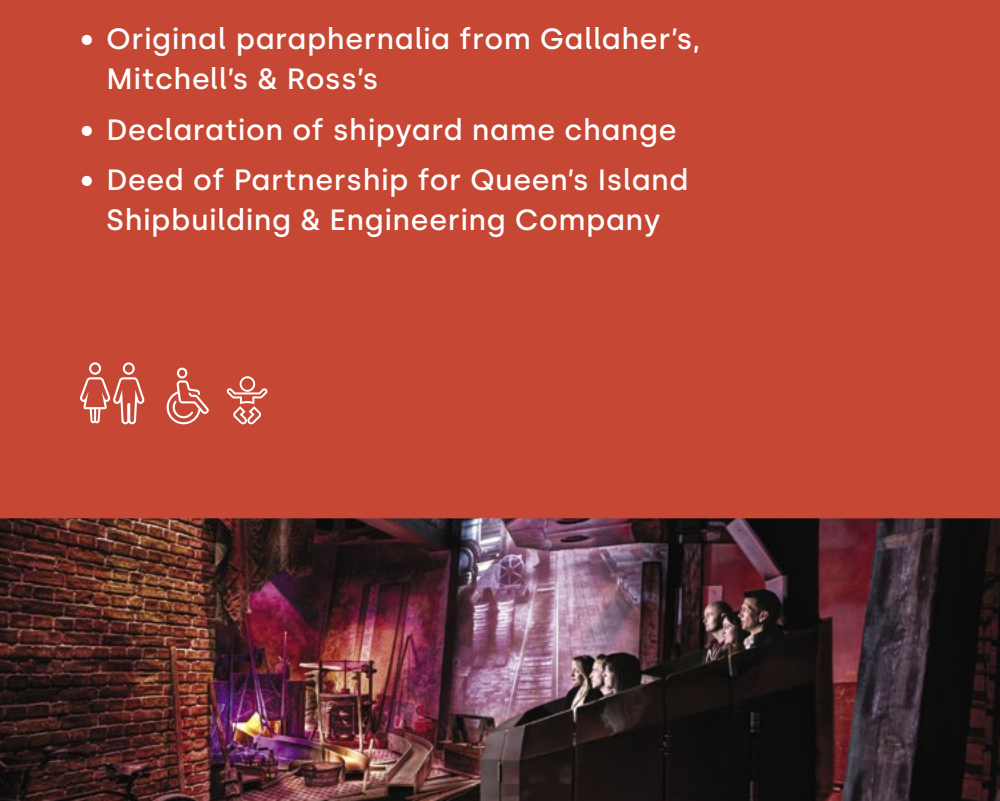




# FIND YOUR WAY AROUND THE STORY

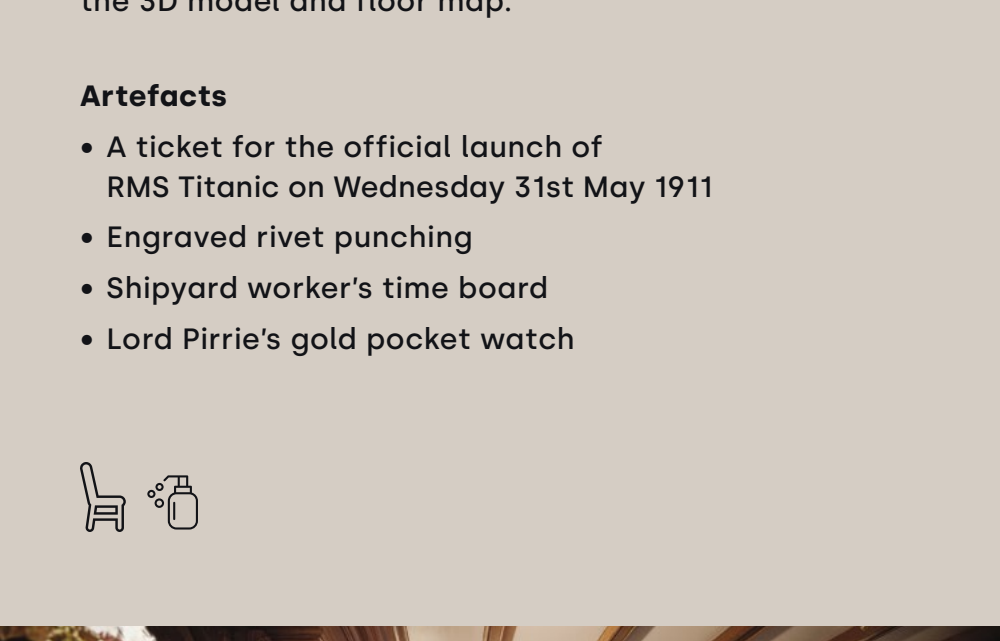
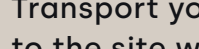


## BOOMTOWN BELFAST

- Deed of Partnership for Queen's Island Shipbuilding & Engineering Company

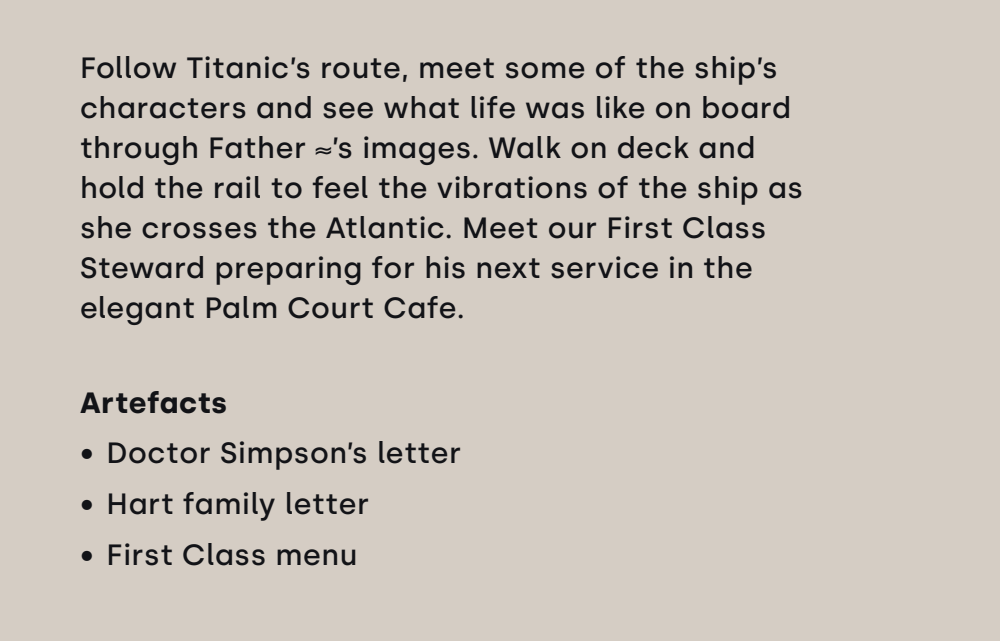


## THE SHIPYARD

Explore the blueprints of Titanic and test your skills on the interactive floor. Look at the scale of the Arrol Gantry and imagine working at those heights. **Take the lift to Level 4** to feel the heat of the steel and hear the riveters at work on the Shipyards Ride (queues possible).

- Shipyards electrical salaries notebook detailing Thomas Andrews' salary

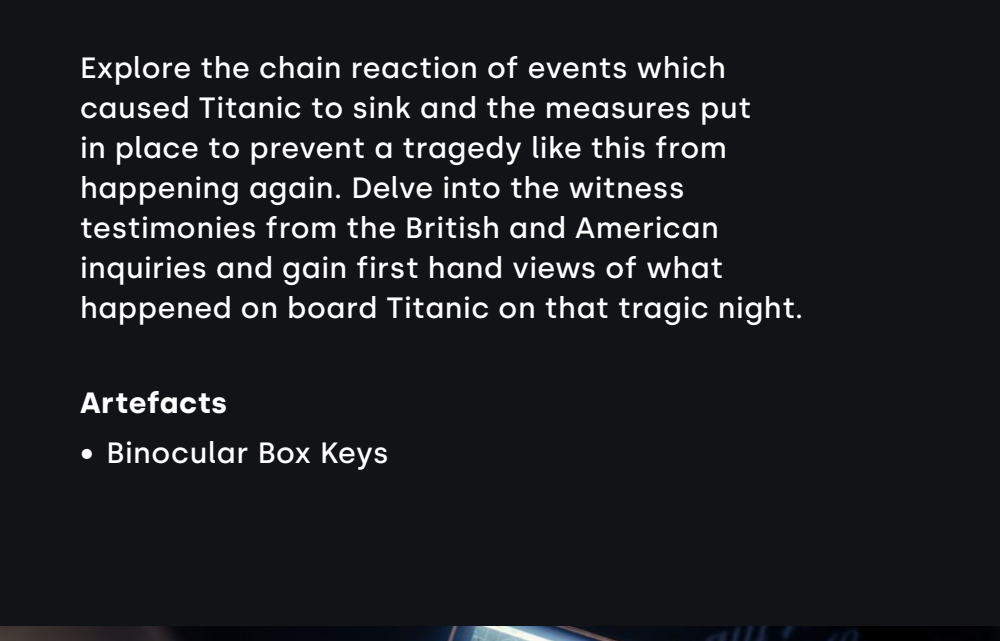


## THE LAUNCH

Transport yourself to 12.13pm on 31st May 1911 to the site where Titanic was built. Soak up the atmosphere and hear the intake of breath as Titanic launches into the water. Imagine the historic slipway and dock in a bygone era with the 3D model and floor map.

- Lord Pirrie's gold pocket watch

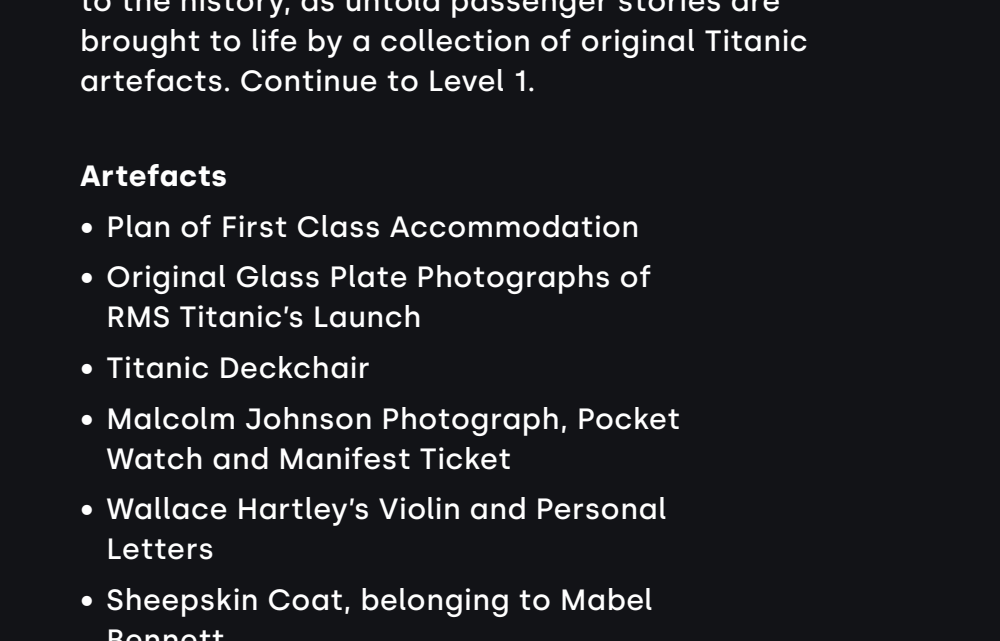


## THE FIT-OUT

Explore the ship from the boiler room to the staircase and up to the bridge on the 3D tour. Get to know the passenger quarters of Titanic. Discover the cabins, the fabrics, the crockery and listen to the music of Wallace Hartley's band as the passengers would have enjoyed it.

Follow Titanic's route, meet some of the ship's characters and see what life was like on board through Father's images. ## THE SINKING

Take yourself to 11.40pm on 14th April 1912 when Titanic tragically hit the iceberg. Feel the atmosphere change as darkness falls. Listen to survivors tell their stories and 'read all about it' in the world's media. Investigate whether you have any links to the Titanic story through the databases of passengers, before following the names of those who survived and who were lost down to level 3.

## BALLARD'S QUEST

Pass through the void, the period of years when the ship was missing. Follow Dr Ballard's quest to fulfil his lifelong dream to discover the wreck of Titanic, an ambition which led to one of the greatest discoveries of our time. Feel the excitement of celebrations which soon give way to silence.



## THE SHIP OF DREAMS

Go on a reflective journey of the hopes and dreams of those impacted by the famous ship. See the entire setting and the centrepiece scale model ship transform with each dream. Descend the staircase to level 2 to get closer to the history, as untold passenger stories are brought to life by a collection of original Titanic artefacts. Continue to Level 1.
