This special 90 minute guided experience for students aged 8 to 12 years looks at RMS Titanic's relationship with the story of European migration in the early 20th century. Using headsets a live guide will lead you and your students through our exhibition galleries

where they will take you through a series of thought provoking, structure activities and direct you to the most pertinent elements of the exhibition ensuring rich opportunities for learning, empathy and inspiration.

1. How does the story of RMS Titanic connect with the story of European migration?

## SUGGESTED LEARNING INTENTIONS

### English

- Developing receptiveness to oral language
- Developing reading strategies
- Developing competence and confidence in using language by practising reading for information
- Developing interests, attitudes, information retrieval skills and ability to think.
- Begin to be aware of how different media present information, ideas and events in different ways
- Developing confidence in writing independently through a written role play activity that encourages empathy

## Geography

- Develop some familiarity with, and engage in practical use of, maps and photographs of different scales and purposes

## PSHE

- Myself and the Wider World - Media Education – explore the role of newspapers and other forms of print media in transmitting the story of RMS Titanic
- Myself – feelings and emotions (empathy for historical characters)
- Myself and others – relating to others – listen actively to others and respect what each person has to say

## HISTORY

- Become familiar with the lives of people from the late 19th and early 20th century including workers in industrialise towns
- Eras of conflict and change – become familiar with ways in which the everyday lives of people changed
- Continuity and change over time – workshops and factories
- Working as an historian – using evidence
- Stories from the lives of people in the past - attitudes and motivations of characters in their historical context
- Stories from the lives of people in the past - become aware of the lives of people from different social, cultural, ethnic and religious backgrounds, including the lives of 'ordinary' as well as 'more famous' people
- Working as an Historian - Cause and Effect
- Eras of conflict and change - the reactions of people to changes and issues they faced
- Story - listen to local people telling stories about their past
- Continuity and change over time - transport
- Life, society, work and culture in the past - migration and emigration
- Continuity and change over time – communications
- Working as an Historian – developing empathy

**Pupils who take a Brave New World tour will leave with a better understanding of the story of RMS Titanic and her role in European migration in the early 20th Century and a richer empathy for the migrants who travelled in her.**
